
# **Curriculum Highlights**

### Year 4 & Year 5 - A Virtual Workshop from the National Archives 15th & 18th September 2023



Pupils developed their historical enquiry skills looking for clues in primary and secondary sources that can tell us about the past.

The children thoroughly enjoyed investigating 'history mysteries', as they were expertly guided by National Archives staff who delivered this exciting workshop.

### Year 1 Understanding the Christian Faith in RE

### Tectonic Plates in Geography - Year 6

Our Year 6 pupils have been studying tectonic plates in our new CUSP Geography curriculum.


As part of this work, the children developed their understanding of key vocabulary for example, tectonic - which comes for the Greek work 'reckon, meaning 'to build'.


The children used maps to identify tectonic plate locations and explored where they cross continents. The children used our new online text books, Curriculum Visions to support their understanding.


The children also discussed and explained the difference between contents and tectonic plates and how they know this as part of a 'thinking hard task'.



Good work Year 6.











### Studying Chroma with Austrian Artist and Architect Hundertwasser - Year 5

The children used a viewfinder to enlarge part of his painting and experimented with watercolours, to replicate his technique and style.








### Comparative language in Mathematics - Year 1

Its been a busy month in Year 1 this September. The children have been developing their understanding of the mathematical symbols for: greater than > , less than < and equal to =.

The children use manipulative to explore and demonstrate their understanding with some fantastic explanations.








### Art and Design - Year 1

Year 1 have been developing their sketching skills in Art and Design.

The children explored the use of crosshatching, scratching and smudging with oil pastels, pencil and graphite.

Using this as a starting point for developing their communication and language skills, the children created their own bear caves in our outdoor learning environment.







### Scale and proportion in Art and Design - Year 6


Year 6 have been working hard with their drawing skills in Art and Design.


The children applied different drawing techniques to give a sense of scale and proportion when drawing still life.


Their work was inspired by the artist, Frida Kahlo, a Mexican painter known for her brightly coloured self portraits.


The chidlnre were able to explain the techniques they had selected and how their work had been influenced by the artist.



### Working hard during Maths and Reading in Reception!

This week, during their maths sessions, our lovely Reception children have been busy exploring the number 4. The children have focused on the cardinality of 4 and practised the skill of one-to-one correspondence to find out how many are in a set. The children examined different representations of 4, knowing that the blocks could be placed in any order on a five frame, yet it still represented 4.

The children worked really well explaining their work and using a range of manipulative to demonstrate their learning. Well done Reception!

During their daily Phonics sessions, the children have been continuing to learn a new phoneme each day, followed by a recap session each Friday. They have worked hard to develop their knowledge and recall at the end of the week!







### Shackleton's Journey in Reading - Year 5

Our Year 5 pupils have been reading Shackleton's Journey as part of our new ambitious Reading curriculum. Shackleton's Journey is the story of Ernest Shackleton's landmark expedition crossing Antarctica from one pole to the other. The text ares use of exploded diagrams and fine details to help the reader envisage themselves on the journey with Shackleton.

Year 5 have been developing their inference skills to extend their understanding of the text.


With a strong focus on vocabulary development as part of our new CUSP Reading Curriculum approach, the children have enjoyed exploring vocabulary that has included:


endurance, peril, arduous, testament, temperament, corrosive, hostile, primitive and more.


The children have enjoyed understanding the etymology of morphology of vocabulary for example:


Perilous - from the latin 'periculum' meaning danger.

The children drew their own avatar and discussed how sometimes people use avatars rather than photographs or real life images.





### Investigating Circuits in Science - Year 6


This month, our Year 6 pupils have been using their Science knowledge notes to help develop their knowledge and practical work in Science.


The children used practical equipment to test out their predictions for different circuit diagrams using bulbs, motors and buzzers.


They used 'flick back' activities to revisit prior knowledge before moving forward with their new learning.

As part of our Jigsaw PSHE curriculum, Year 1 pupils have been understanding what it means to be proud of themselves and others.


The children received tickets that told them how we at Barlows are proud of them and discussed they types of things that make people feel proud.

Please ensure you have applied for your child's secondary school place (current Year 6 pupils only) by 11:59pm on 31/10/23.




