Punctuality Reminder

Our school day officially begins at 8:45 am, providing students with a
chance to settle in and prepare for lessons that commence promptly at
9:00 am.

Punctuality is crucial as it not only sets a positive tone for the day but also demonstrates respect for the learning environment and the educational process.

Arriving on time allows students to engage fully with their lessons and fosters a commitment to their own academic success.

We have observed that a small number of students are arriving after 9:00 am, which can cause disruption not only to their own learning but also to that of their peers.

Late arrivals often miss important instructions and can find it challenging to integrate smoothly into ongoing activities. Consequently, it is essential that we work together to encourage students to arrive at school with ample time to spare.

To support your child in gaining the habit of punctuality, we recommend the following strategies:

Routine Setting: Establishing a consistent morning routine will help your child prepare for the school day and ensure they arrive on time. This may include setting earlier wake-up times and organising belongings the night before.

Travel Arrangements: Please review your child's travel arrangements to ensure they allow sufficient time to reach school before the start of lessons.

Positive Reinforcement: Recognising and celebrating instances of punctuality can motivate your child to maintain this habit.

We kindly ask for your cooperation in reinforcing the importance of punctuality with your child. Together, we can ensure that every student has the best possible opportunity to thrive in their educational journey.
